I was part of a violent group during the 1997 civil war in Albania. When the civil war ended, I was put in prison. When I first heard about TPJ, I was unsure if I could join since I was an atheist. So I asked the organizers if I could sign up for TPJ. The organizer said, "Absolutely!"

*So I started the Course. I went through the whole Course but was not sure what I believed. **On graduation day, I told my Course Leader, "I am no longer an atheist. I don't believe in any religion, but I believe there is a God."***

When I started the Course, I did not have much interest in doing it because I was disconnected from the Word of God. In truth, I thought that God had forgotten and abandoned me, because I had received a sentence of over 42 years. **However, through TPJ, I understood that God never abandons us. On the contrary, we ignore Him. No matter the size of the mistake we make, nor the size of our sins, God will always be with us, waiting for a cry for help because the word of God says: "Come to me, all of you who are fatigued and burdened, and I will give you rest."**

Two Inmates Find God Together

A poor, small, and uneducated prisoner who had graduated from TPJ was hired by two rich prisoner as their paid servant. Neither of the rich prisoners were religious and neither had ever responded to the invitation to join TPJ. Beyond serving these men physically, the servant prisoner decided to do something for their souls. He managed to capture their curiosity by telling them about the journey of a Prisoner just like them.

He shared verses from the Bible that he had memorized. He often prayed the Lord would give him an opportunity to open his lips to share the good news. Finally, he shared and the two rich prisoners joined TPJ.

*During TPJ they were very impressed by the Gospel. They were intrigued to learn more about who Jesus is, why He came and what it means to be His follower. **The Lord open their hearts to the truth of God's Kingdom and step by step they began to love the Lord more and more.***

Now, they are TPJ volunteers.

Story of a TPJ Coordinator

A prisoner approached a TPJ Coordinator one day and asked her to go find his work supervisor to help him post bail. Although the directions and instructions were vague, the Coordinator agreed to talk with the prison officials to see if she could do this favor.

When she was called to the private meeting with a prison official, the officer asked if she was prepared to assist in this manner and he was stunned when she said she was.

After several days of looking, she found his supervisor. The inmate's boss told the volunteer about how much she had been worrying about what had happened to the prisoner. She told the volunteer that the reason this man was imprisoned was because of a family dispute which left him nearly homeless. Not wanting to create family disharmony, he did not fight but instead allowed himself to be arrested because of false claim by his brother. After hearing this story, the volunteer gave the prisoner's supervisor his contact information and they went their ways.

When the TPJ volunteer returned the following week for the TPJ session, the prisoner, who had been always tense and worried, met her with a wide smile. His boss had helped him get bail. TPJ not only teaches through the Course but also by the volunteers' demonstration of God's grace.
